Homer Clarence Fisher was born on Sunday, April 15th, 1945, the seventh and last child born to Clarence George Jefferson Fisher and Mary Elizabeth Lampley Fisher of Bon Aqua, Tennessee. Homer started dating Frances Atchison and married her six months later on June 17th, 1967. The couple celebrated their 52nd anniversary in June. They made their home in Bon Aqua and added their daughter Andrea Leigh Fisher on October 14, 1968 and their son David Clarence Christian Fisher on August 22, 1971.

Homer worked for State Industries for his entire adult life and retired there after 44 years. Once he retired, he enjoyed fishing, oil painting, and fossil collecting; He was a member of the Clearview Church of Christ having served as a deacon and an elder for several years. Homer was a committed member of the Clearview Church of Christ and always looked forward to chances to fellowship together and worship with his church family.

Homer welcomed Jeffery Lynn Nash to the family when he married Andrea on May 11th, 1991. His grandson, Ethan Tacker Nash was born on September 12, 1995 with granddaughter Maggie Elizabeth Nash being born November 5th, 1999.

Homer was preceded in death by his parents, his sister Louise Fisher, brother Herbert Fisher and sister Birdie Parrot. He is survived by sisters Dot Jones of

Bon Aqua, Etta Richardson of Murfreesboro, and Lillie Warren of Bon Aqua.

Homer is descended from German, English, and Italian ancestors. His wife Frances is descended from ancestors from Sweden, Finland, England, and Native America.
