He loved the outdoors and spent as much time as he could in nature. He and Lorie took daily trips down to the creek. One summer they even had some pet crawfish and a pet fish that would allow him to pet them before he fed them some bread crumbs. He simply had a way with nature. This showed through his ability to train horses. He could take the wildest horse and turn it into a gentle pony. He also enjoyed making traditional Native American jewelry, crafting walking sticks and having barbecues.

Mark had a smile that lit up the world and a magnetism about him that drew people in. He will be remembered for his friendship, honesty and caring nature. He loved his family, and at times could be protective, but always showed special concern for his Mom and Sister. He will be deeply missed by all those who knew and loved him.
