“ I have about 27 years of wonderful memories of Peggy, but I'll share a couple favorites. My first memory of her was in 1988 when our family of 8 moved to Centerville, TN. We attended Centerville church of Christ and usually sat on the left side a little over half way back in the auditorium during worship. I couldn't help but notice this very classy and attractive middle-aged woman across the aisle from me on the right side. Always sitting beside her was a very handsome, well-mannered high-school student who I would see in the halls at HCHS. One day, I asked my teacher friend in the classroom beside me who he was, and she told me. For some reason, it always impressed me that he sat beside his Granny at church and not with friends. Little did I know that he would become my first beloved son-by-love (son-in-law) just a few years later. My second memory was just a few years ago when Peggy made a beautiful red and white afghan and sent it to me by Brandi. I've kept warm with it during many chilly nights, but it was her caring and love that gave the greatest warmth. Ok, I know that's two memories, but there's one more that may best describe the Peggy that I will always love and miss. In April of 2014, when my mom was in the Care Center here, I had taken off from school for 2 weeks and decided I would try to go back and see if that would be possible. Peggy came to see Mom and told me not to worry, she'd come over and stay with Mom while I was at school. The next day when I went to feed Mom during my lunch break at school, there sat Peggy right next to Mom's bed. When I looked surprised and said, "Peggy, you're here!" She gave me her very reassuring Peggy look and just said, "I told you I would be." That proved to be the the only day I could pull myself away from Mom, but the next day, Peggy brought Mom new gowns, one of which she was wearing when she took her last breath in my arms 2 days later. Peggy invested herself in the lives of others, and she laid up her treasures in heaven. I'll never forget our visits and talks. She loved her family!!! She loved her family!!! When she came to the Care Center here last week, I was glad I would have the opportunity to visit with her and tell her what she meant to me and our family, and during our visits, I reminded her of all the wonderful things she'd done for us. I loved her dearly, although I'm

not sure I told her that as easily as she told me. I'd like to think that it was God's plan that I'd be standing beside her with Bob when she slipped safely into the arms of Jesus. There's one thing certain, she will live on in the hearts of those she changed, like me. She and I shared children and grandchildren -- her life made all the difference for our family.
